PRC Promotes Chuan Teng to Chief Operating Officer

SAN FRANCISCO (September 01, 2022) – [PRC](#), the San Francisco-based nonprofit providing comprehensive services to those living with HIV/AIDS, mental illness and/or substance use disorder, announced Chuan Teng as its new chief operating officer.

In this new role, Chuan will assume agency authority in the absence of the chief executive officer and oversee and administer the organization's suite of behavioral health and social programs, as well as People Experience, the organizations' human resources department. Additionally, Teng will work to align programming with the organization's strategic priorities by supporting and enhancing existing services, leading the development and implementation of new services, and promoting internal and external collaboration.

Chuan has worked for PRC for over ten years, starting as a staff attorney helping client access public benefits. During her tenure, she served as the managing legal director of PRC's Legal Advocacy Program, where she helped launch its healthcare legal services practice, then as the chief of programs and confidentiality officer, then as chief of client services and talent.
