

Gather Information

You'll need ID, SSN or proof of lawful presence and income information.

Consider Healthcare Needs

Do you want to stay with your current doctor or find a new one? What are your medications?

Do you need any special services?



Explore Insurance Options

Visit coveredca.com or call 1-800-300-1506. Provide income, household size, and coverage needs to see plan choices. Compare premium costs, co-pays, and out of pocket maximums. Check if your doctor is within network.


