# Kaiser San Francisco HIV Care & Prevention Program

The KPSF HIV Care and Prevention Program is a multidisciplinary specialty program within the Department of Adult and Family Medicine.

Comprehensive care is provided by:

- HIV Specialist Physician Nurse Practitioners Specialist Pharmacists Nurse Medical Case Manager - HIV Benefit Coordinators
- In addition, Kaiser members have access to coordinated care with:
- Gender Pathways Transgender Clinic health educators registered dietitians
- specialty clinics, etc.

### Accessing Kaiser SF Long-Acting Injectable Program

The KPSF HIV Care and Prevention Program is a multidisciplinary specialty program within the Department of Adult and Family Medicine.

- Conduct an intake with the KPSF HIV Care & Prevention Program
- Establish Care with the Care or PrEP program provider
- Consultation/Interview with LAI coordinator
  - Inclusion Criteria
  - Review Treatment History
  - Review Benefits and Coverage
  - LAI Medication Review
  - Optional Oral Lead in
  - Follow-up Review and Agreement
- Refer to appropriate Kaiser office (HIV Community Benefits)
- Follow-up LAI protocol
- Assess Program Adherence and Next Steps



## **Different Coverage Types at Kaiser**

- Commercial Plans\* (usually employer plans)
- Kaiser Individual Plans: Kaiser Permanente Individual Family (HIPP)
- Covered California Plans (HIPP)
- Medi-Cal Plans (within 12 months of previous Kaiser membership)
- Medicare Plans\*: Kaiser Permanente Senior Advantage (MPPP)
- Medicare Medi-Cal Plans: Kaiser Special Needs Plan aka Medi-Medi plans (enroll anytime)

\*Grandfathered, federal employee, and Medicare plans exempt from PrEP recommendation

### Kaiser LAI Cost & Assistance/Benefits Programs

There are 3 main billing models for Clinics.

- <u>Buy and Bill</u>: Under this model, a clinic will use their funds to buy LAI PrEP & submit claim to the insurance company for reimbursement
- <u>Pharmacy Benefit:</u> Licensed specialty pharmacy can process the Rx & receive payment for it immediately
- Medical Benefit:

Some insurance companies cover LAI PrEP under Medical Benefit & allow a specialty pharmacy to fill Rx. Specialty pharmacies include CVS Specialty Pharmacy & Alliance Rx Walgreens



### Kaiser LAI Cost & Assistance/Benefits Programs

Kaiser's Billing Model Differs:

• <u>Clinicallly Administered Medication</u>: Injected medication is billed according to a percentage of total medication cost of 10%, 20% or \$0 copay according to insurance coverage and benefit.

- This cost includes the licensed provider injecting medication and cost of LAI



### Kaiser LAI Cost & Assistance/Benefits Programs

Currently there are few assistance program options

- <u>People Living with HIV:</u> Enrolling in HIPP or MPPP through the California Dept of Public Health (CDPH) for outpatient copay assistance
- PrEP Patients:
  - Kaiser Medical Assistance Program under \$43k
  - Viiv Connect is not usable at this time
- Looking Forward:
  - PrEP Assistance Program (PrEP AP): the CDPH's program will be implementing an LAI copay assistance
  - All HMO Providers must provide LAI copay coverage by September 2024
